

Florence Arlene Rognes Tate, 86, of Fayetteville, NC, passed away Thursday, March 24, 2022, at her home with her beloved family by her side. Arlene was born February 11, 1936, in Brooklyn, NY, to the late Ellen and Ingolf Rognes.

While in Bible School, a friend of Arlene's showed her picture to James. When James saw Arlene's picture, he told his friend, "I hear wedding bells". James requested permission from their Bible School to court Arlene with a chaperone. After being together for just three hours, James asked Arlene to marry him and she said yes! Arlene married James in 1954 and served him faithfully as a Pastor's wife for 45 years.

Her first ministry was her family. Her second ministry was to graciously host speakers and congregants at their home. Arlene excelled at being a gifted clarinet player and alto singer.

James Laury Tate, 91, of Fayetteville, NC, passed away on Monday, June 6, 2022, at his home with his beloved family by his side. James was born on May 12, 1931, in Vineland, NJ, to the late James Vincent Tate and Edna Laury Tate. He was preceded in death by his wife of 67 years, who was the love of his life.

James considered himself a Pastor for 70 years. Although he retired many years earlier, he always had a Pastor's heart.

James and Arlene are survived by sons, Raymond Tate and wife Patti, Wayne Tate and wife Rachel; and daughter, Laurie Damico and husband David; 9 grandchildren and 19 great grandchildren.

Pastor Tate's Call to Ministry


After being baptized in the Holy Spirit, Jim felt God prompting him to go to Bible School. He believed it would be for just one year to strengthen his faith. Being led by the Holy Spirit, he went back a second year and a third, and his final year.

The month before his commencement, the school experienced a revival that lasted 10 days. At the end of that season, on a Sunday morning, the Lord impressed Jim to remain in the chapel while the students went to lunch. On his knees, the Lord began to unfold a series of visions which ended in the Lord asking him, will you preach my word? Jim replied, "I would really rather not." The Lord asked the question a second and third time, to which he surrendered and said "I accept your will."

Before commencement, he had a call from the District Superintendent of the NY/NJ District of the Assemblies of God asking him to go to Beacon NY where 3 elderly individuals were asking for an AG church to be started. He went to Beacon after having preached only one time up until this point. When he went into the sanctuary in Beacon where services were to be held, Jim saw the huge old pulpit desk he saw in his vision back in the chapel at Bible school. This confirmed his call both to ministry as a Pastor and to Beacon.


